SANDS PARK BUTTERFLY GARDEN PROJECT Do you like to dig in the dirt?

Earlier this year, Sherie Bleiler approached the Garden Club Board and asked if we would like to get involved with the butterfly garden at Sands Park, a new park located in SW Cape Coral. The Board agreed this would be a wonderful idea to participate in the development and maintenance of the new garden. During the past three months, eight club members have become city park volunteers and added 127 small plants. However, the team still needs more volunteers to become involved with this wonderful project. They have removed many yards of overplanted dune sunflower as well. However, trimming of the dune sunflower is still a serious problem, overtaking the regular bushes that have been planted. If you would like to trim some borders between the sunflower and bushes, please bring a hedge trimmer. This is a 2-person job, with one person pulling and holding up the vines, while the other person wields the trimmer.

Rotary Park had money they needed to spend to buy plants! Sherie ordered some plants from All Native nursery – lantana, salvia, and milkweed – which have all been planted. Rotary Park now has more money to purchase plants, but we need more volunteers as well. All you will need to do is bring a large shovel plus your small trowel. There are always weeds to attend to as well. Please bring a weeder or small hand shovel to help remove the full root. Bring a kneeler or stool or whatever helps you weed comfortably. At times, watering may need to happen. If this is the case, the volunteers will be asked to bring water jugs from home. You are welcome to visit the beginning stages of this "work in progress" at any time. The current members of the team are Ann Fowler, Cindy Wasilak, Deborah Leh, Elsa Schutzman, Sally Stevens, Tanya Rowland, Valorie Breen, Sherie Bleiler, and Reina Diaz, a college student who was awarded a Garden Club scholarship in April 2023. Thank you all for your hard work to promote civic beautification in our city.

Design Circle Meeting

The first Design Circle meeting of the 2024-2025 season will be taking place on Monday, September 16th starting at 1:00 p.m. at Kathy Woodlock's house (Kathy's information is in the membership directory). The group will be working on a traditional line design (regular size or petite). FFGC has decided to focus on several designs for their "What's Your Type" publication this year and traditional designs is one of them.

You will need line material such as mothers-in-law tongue or papyrus along with filler material and greens. Kathy will have oasis, and she also has some papyrus.

CHORES AND PLANTING GUIDE – ZONE 10

- If summer beds need refreshing, try scarlet sage, nasturtium, celosia, and wax begonia for color into fall.
- Plant gladiolus corms every 2 weeks to stagger blooming. Stake each plant.
- Plant herbs that tolerate the warm temperatures of early fall, such as Mexican tarragon, mint, rosemary, and basil.
- Numerous cool-season (as well as warm-season) vegetable crops can be planted.
- Consider placing native shrubs, like beautyberry, firebush, and dahoon holly, where
 you can view the birds that enjoy them.
- Numerous municipalities prohibit the application of fertilizer to lawns and/or landscape plants during the summer rainy season (June–September). See if such an ordinance exists in your area.
- Prepare the fall vegetable garden if not done in August. Using transplants from your local garden center will get the garden off to a fast start, but seeds provide a wider variety from which to choose.
- Divide and replant perennials and bulbs that have grown too large or need rejuvenation. Add organic matter to planting beds and monitor water needs during establishment.
- Check that irrigation systems are providing good coverage and operating properly before summer rains taper off.
- Fertilize citrus with a balanced fertilizer either this month or in October. Use controlled-release nitrogen because rain will not leach it from the soil too quickly.
