It is something you are familiar with since it is a typical FTD display. There are two types of Mass Designs: American Traditional Mass and Creative Mass Design. The difference is very slight as is visible in the sample pictures below. The traditional has a closed silhouette whereas the creative has more open spaces. The rhythm in both cases is within the design and the plant material is integrated and not grouped.



Intro to Florida Friendly Landscaping Saturday, November 16, 2024 – 10:00 a.m. Join us for a Florida Friendly Landscaping (FFL) class to learn the nine principles that guide Florida-friendly landscaping in Lee County. Each principle is covered in class so you can apply what you learn to your own garden. Plant selection and placement, efficient irrigation, and proper mulching will be discussed. Learn how reducing your use of fertilizers and insecticides will help minimize the amount of chemicals that reach and pollute our waters. In these unusual times, we can still get outside and garden, so join us to discover landscape management practices that will lead to a Florida-friendly yard while helping to protect our waters! CHORES AND PLANTING GUIDE - ZONE 10

- Create a display of fall colors with cool-season plants. Some examples include impatiens, strawflower, cape daisy, and pansy.
- Many bulbs like to get their start in cool weather. Bulbs to plant this month include amaryllis, crinum, and the many varieties of elephant's ear.
- Continue planting herbs from seeds or plants. A wide variety of herbs like cooler, dryer weather, including cilantro, dill, fennel, parsley, sage, and thyme.
 - Lots of choices exist for November including beans, broccoli, kale, snow/English peas, and strawberries.
- Divide and replant overgrown perennials and bulbs now so that they establish before the coolest weather arrives.
- Turn off systems and water only if needed. Plants need less supplemental watering in cooler weather.
- Watch for hornworms on tomatoes and poinsettias planted in the landscape. This pest can quickly defoliate a plant. Handpick or treat only the infested area.








